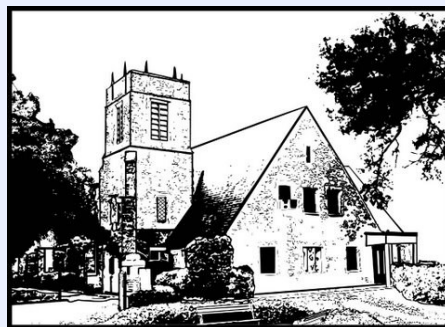

We believe in one God,
